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### Healing Service

Many are afraid of the Corona Virus, and sickness in general. I don't want to make light of this virus or any other sickness or disease, but I cannot diminish the power of God and His desire to see you healed.

Healing is in the heart of the Father for His children. God has done everything needed to make sure we are healed. Father sent Jesus and He paid the price in full for our healing and salvation—spirit, soul and body.

#### **Isaiah 53:4-5 (TS2009)**

4 Truly, He has borne our sicknesses and carried our pains. Yet we reckoned Him smitten, stricken by Elohim, and afflicted.

5 But He was pierced for our transgressions, He was crushed for our crookednesses. The chastisement for our peace was upon Him, and by His stripes we are healed.

Isaiah the Prophet paints a picture of how the Messiah, Jesus would suffer and why He would suffer. Approximately 700 years before Jesus was born this prophecy showcased the Crucifixion and the result of Jesus's death.

**Questions:** Is it sometimes difficult to see Healing and Salvation as the same thing, two sides of the same coin? If yes, why? If no, why?

If it is difficult for you to fully accept this above truth, what can you do to overcome this difficulty?

#### **1 Peter 2:24 (NKJV)**

who Himself bore our sins in His own body on the tree, that we, having died to sins, might live for righteousness—by whose stripes you were healed.

Peter writes this after the resurrection of Jesus. Peter points to the Prophecy given by Isaiah and shows that in Christ this Prophecy was fulfilled.

Healing and Salvation are found in Christ Jesus. Jesus bore our sicknesses, carried our pains, and by His stripes (wounds) we are healed. We are Saved in spirit, soul and body.

**Question:** Why do you think Isaiah and Peter say the same thing (both Old Testament and New Testament)?

**Matthew 8:2-3**

2 And behold, a leper came and worshiped Him, saying, "Lord, if You are willing, You can make me clean."

3 Then Jesus put out *His* hand and touched him, saying, "I am willing; be cleansed." Immediately his leprosy was cleansed.

This passage shows that Jesus is willing to heal and cleanse the leper. This willingness to heal hasn't changed in 2000 years. Jesus healed then and He heals today.

***If you are listening you will hear Jesus saying, "I am willing" be healed.***

**Questions:** "Jesus is willing to heal." How does this make you feel? Is this truth easy or difficult to accept? Why?

**Hebrews 13:8**

Jesus Christ *is* the same yesterday, today, and forever.

Jesus has not changed. He healed those who were sick when He was on the earth and He still heals today. Jesus wants to set you free from all sickness and disease.

**Luke 10:19**

Behold, I give you the authority to trample on serpents and scorpions, and over all the power of the enemy, and nothing shall by any means hurt you.

Not only has Jesus promised to heal us but He gives us power and authority over the enemy. We now have all the power and authority we need to destroy the works of satan- including sickness and disease.

**Questions:** Jesus is the same today as He was 2000 years ago. What does this have to do with healing? What does this have to do with you?

After reading Luke 10:19, is it safe to say that Jesus will heal the sick through our touch? Do you have authority over sickness and disease?
