Exodus 20:7

You shall not take the name of the LORD
your God in vain, for the LORD will not hold
him guiltless who takes His name in vain.

Take (Heb. 5375) *nasah*

1) to lift, bear up, carry, take

a.) to bear, carry, support, sustain, endure

Vain (Heb. 7723) *shav*

1) emptiness, vanity, falsehood

1a) emptiness, nothingness, vanity

1b) emptiness of speech, lying

1c) worthlessness (of conduct)

My Paraphrase:

You shall not carry the name of the Lord your God in a manner that makes it empty and meaningless.

Jesus Said...

John 14:7-9

7 "If you had known Me, you would have known My Father also; and from now on you know Him and have seen Him."

John 14:7-9 (continued)

8 Philip said to Him, "Lord, show us the Father, and it is sufficient for us."

9 Jesus said to him, "Have I been with you so long, and yet you have not known Me, Philip? He who has seen Me has seen the Father; so how can you say, 'Show us the Father'?"

“He who has seen Me has seen the Father”

So what does God look like?

YehoVAH-RAPHA.....Exodus 15:26

"The Lord my/our Healer"

“By His stripes we are healed” Are we praying for one another? Do we believe that Jesus is still the Healer? Many Christians don't believe that Jesus still heals- they are taking the Lords name in vain.

YehoVAH-NISSI.....Exodus 17:15

"The Lord my/our Banner"

This was actually the name of an altar that Moses built in the wilderness after the Victory over Amalek. This is where Joshua and the Israelites had victory as long as Moses held his hands up over the battle. This is a type of Spiritual warfare and Intercession. Are we interceding for one another? Are we a living expression of Jehovah-Nissi?

YehoVAH-ROHI.....Psalm 23:1

"The Lord my/our Shepherd"

YehoVAH-TSIDKENU.....Jeremiah 23:6

"The Lord my/our Righteousness"

YehoVAH-SHAMMAH.....Ezekiel 48:35


"The Lord who is There (Present)"
